ENMET LLC is aware of the conflict mineral reporting obligations legislated by Section 1502 of the U.S. Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform Act and we are committed to helping our customers comply with these reporting requirements. ENMET is not a publicly held company so we are not obligated by this act to file a "Conflict Minerals Reporting Template" response with the SEC. However, we will be more than willing to share any and all pertinent information relative to our suppliers sourcing of these Conflict Minerals moving forward, to the best of our knowledge.

ENMET LLC does not manufacture components from raw materials. Therefore, we must rely upon our supply chain to advise us as to the conflict mineral status of the components within our products.

ENMET does not knowingly use nor condone the use of any conflict minerals, however, ENMET does not, within its organization, possess the capability to trace, with certainty, the origins of the raw ores or virgin metals which are incorporated in its products.
